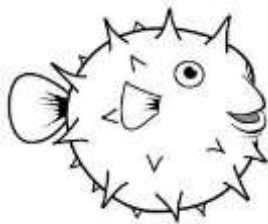
Section 1**(8 marks)****SEAHORSES**

Seahorses are a type of small fish. They are very unusual looking, which makes some people think they are not real and are a myth like mermaids. *(paragraph 1)*

Seahorses get their name from the shape of their head, which is long and horse-shaped. They have a curved tail and range in size from 1cm to 30cm. Seahorses vary in colour through white, yellow, black, brown and grey, and some are banded or even spotted. Instead of scales like most fish, seahorses have a hard outer covering like a crab, with little spines like a puffer fish. Their eyes move independently like a lizard, so they can look forwards and backwards at the same time. Seahorses have a snout like an armadillo and no teeth. *(paragraph 2)*

Section 2

They are found all over the world in the warm water of reefs, in seaweed beds and also in freshwater. Seahorses are not very good swimmers and move very slowly, mostly up and down with their heads up and their tails down. They use their monkey-like tail like a hand to hold onto sea plants while they look for food so they won't be swept away by the current. Seahorses use their snout like a straw to eat their food, which includes krill, small shrimp, and other tiny crustaceans. *(paragraph 3)*

Seahorses can change colour very quickly, like a chameleon, and blend in with their surroundings. This is called camouflage. It is a very effective way of protecting themselves from their enemies. *(paragraph 4)*



Female seahorses produce eggs but they deposit them in a male's kangaroo-like "pouch". The males keep them in their pouch for about 40-50 days until they hatch. They give birth to about 100 sea ponies that are less than 1 cm in length.

The sea ponies must now look after themselves. Seahorses can live four about four years.

(paragraph 5)

Seahorses are mainly endangered by water pollution, because they live close to the coast or in polluted waterways. Huge numbers are collected to be used for aquarium pets in some countries. In other countries they are also dried and sold as souvenirs or used in traditional medicine to treat such things as asthma and skin diseases. *(paragraph 6)*
